



Feedback Analysis and Action Taken Report 2021-22

The college collects the feedback on curriculum aspects and courses from different stakeholders such as the students, teachers, parents, alumni and Employers. The college maintains an IQAC as a quality consistence and quality enhancement measure. The IQAC ensures and analyze the academic excellence at student and faculty levels through feedback mechanism with periodical analysis.

The college of thoroughly reviews the curriculum for every academic year. In supervision of IQAC, various departments and committees reinforce the curriculum by incorporating updated information and social issues. The college collects the feedback through Google form on Curriculum which is prescribed by the university, further college website invites all stockholder to provide feedback through provided link.

The college conducts annual Alumni Meet, in which suggestions and feedback is received from Alumni students. Feedback from industrial management, R & D establishments and professionals is obtained through college website's feedback link. The provided feedback data is analyzed and presented to the university for necessary implementation in curriculum. The feedback report also provided to the BOS faculties members for necessary action at their BOS meetings.

Feedback Analysis 2021-22

1. Students Feedback on Curriculum

- 43.8% students responded as Good, 29.4% as Very Good and 16.6% as excellent on curriculum regarding Learning Values (In terms of Concept, Knowledge, Manual Skills etc).
- 41.7% students responded as Good, 30.9% as Very Good and 15.4% as excellent regarding Relevance of the units in Syllabus.
- 43.2% students responded as Good, 24.2% as Very Good and 14.1% as excellent on curriculum regarding Allocations of period and weightage
- 41% students responded as Good, 26.9% as Very Good and 14.9% as excellent on curriculum regarding Fundamental Coverage
- 36.8% students responded as Good, 27.2% as Very Good and 19.6% as excellent on curriculum regarding Technological Advancements

- 40.7% students responded as Good, 25.6% as Very Good and 12.8% as excellent on curriculum regarding Size of syllabus in terms of the load on the student
- 39.3% students responded as Good, 26.4% as Very Good and 15.8% as excellent on curriculum regarding Extra learning or self learning considering the design of the courses
- 30.9% students responded as Good, 30.3% as Very Good and 20% as excellent on curriculum regarding Clarity and relevance of textual reading material (Library)
- 35.7% students responded as Good, 31.7% as Very Good and 17.7% as excellent on curriculum regarding objectives stated for each of the Syllabus/Course
- 39.5% students responded as Good, 30% as Very Good and 15% as excellent on curriculum regarding Extent of efforts required by the students.

2. Teachers Feedback on Curriculum 2021-22

- 57.1% teachers responded as agree and 40.3% responded as strongly agree regarding Syllabus is suitable to the course.
- 53.2% teachers responded as agree and 39% responded as strongly agree regarding Syllabus is need based.
- 46.8% teachers responded as agree and 45.5% responded as strongly agree regarding Aims and objectives of the syllabi are well defined and clear to teachers and students.
- 41.6% teachers responded as agree and 46.8% responded as strongly agree regarding Course content is followed by corresponding reference books /materials
- 46.8% teachers responded as agree and 46.8% responded as strongly agree regarding course/syllabus has good balance between theory and practical.
- 44.2% teachers responded as agree and 44.2% responded as strongly agree regarding course/syllabus of this subject increased my knowledge and perspective in the subject area.
- 57.1% teachers responded as agree and 33.8% responded as strongly agree regarding course/program of studies carries sufficient number of optional papers.
- 41.6% teachers responded as agree and 42.9% responded as strongly agree regarding books prescribed/listed as reference materials are relevant, updated and appropriate.

3. Parents Feedback on Curriculum 2021-22

- 56.4% parents responded as agree and 15.9% responded as strongly agree regarding holistic development of students is ensured by participation of students in various sports, cultural and co-curricular activities organized throughout the year.
- 46.2% parents responded as agree and 19.5% responded as strongly agree regarding students are sensitized towards cross cutting issues like gender equality, environment and sustainability, ethics and values etc., through relevant courses in the curriculum as well as through community service participation in various awareness campaigns on socially relevant issues etc.
- 46.2% parents responded as agree and 20.5% responded as strongly agree regarding academic flexibility embedded in the curriculum provides opportunities to students to pursue their interest by choosing from a vast number of pathways / electives from own area / specialization as well as from other areas.
- 53.3% parents responded as agree and 21.5% responded as strongly agree regarding courses in the curriculum promote skills enhancement and students are encouraged, supported to Digital Literacy and Cyber Security.
- 45.6% parents responded as agree and 23.1% responded as strongly agree regarding curriculum has been designed to make students industry ready by imparting analytical and reasoning, language and soft skills in addition to technical competencies.
- 49.2% parents responded as agree and 24.1% responded as strongly agree regarding the curriculum is outcome based and the expected outcomes, through various courses, are attained.

4. Alumni Feedback on Curriculum 2021-22

- 51.8% alumni responded as agree and 29.7% responded as strongly agree regarding contents of the Syllabus were revised at reasonable intervals.
- 50% alumni responded as strongly agree and 37.1% responded as agree regarding course/ syllabus increased knowledge and understanding of the subject studied.
- 47.1% alumni responded as agree and 37.1% responded as strongly agree regarding course curriculum fulfills the expectations.
- 42.9% alumni responded as strongly agree and 44.4% responded as agree regarding Course helped in developing personality.
- 45% alumni responded as agree and 37.6% responded as strongly agree regarding prescribed books were relevant, updated and appropriate.
- 53.2% alumni responded as agree and 33.8% responded as strongly agree regarding Course meet contemporary requirements.
- 45% alumni responded as agree and 39.1% responded as strongly agree regarding syllabus was need based as per the requirement of the job/industry.


- 44.1% alumni responded as agree and 36.5% responded as strongly agree regarding syllabus was directly related to enhancing practical competencies.
